VISITORS PRESENTATIONS, PETITION AND CORRESPONDENCE

1. Jennifer Romero – 2105 Naples Ave

Jennifer Romero asked the Planning Commission and the Council to consider closing off the street, in the Hans Hagen Development, instead of having the street open to traffic. Currently there is traffic with young children walking to the Cologne Academy and bicycling and for safety concerns would like to see the road closed. Dean Johnson recommended the city contact Charles Joos, Fire Chief and City Attorney Larry Harris and get their opinions on what the affect would be to close the street.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. Splash Pad

City Administrator Jesse Dickson reported City Attorney Larry Harris requested a delay in approving the Splash Pad project. Larry Harris after reviewing the bid process Harris recommended re-addressing the project at the April $20^{\rm th}$, 2015 meeting.

Councilmember Kyle Evenski stated it is a project that will take time to order the equipment and get it installed for the summer months. Evenski stated the more time delays the later it will be to see it completed.

2. Resolution No. 15-13 Modifying Resolution No. 00-02 Regarding a Fire Department Advisory Board.

Motion by Meyer seconded by Evenski to approve Resolution No. 15-13 Modifying Resolution No. 00-02 Fire Department Advisory Board. Motion passed unanimously.

- 3. Hans Hagen Homes 17th Addition, Preliminary Plat
 - a. City Planner Dean Johnson reviewed the Village at Cologne 17th Addition Preliminary/Final Plat. John Rask, Vice President Hans Hagen Homes reported the 2nd Addition was originally plated for four 5-unit townhomes and four 9 unit townhomes. The four 5-unit building have been built The 17th Addition is proposing to exchange the four 9-unit townhome buildings for 16 detached townhomes.

City Planner Dean Johnson recommended approval of the preliminary plat subject to the following:

- Construction of the trail from the existing northerly private drive to the existing east-west trail lying south of the development.
- Vacation of the existing public utility easements in the southerly half of the Village at Cologne 2nd Addition.
- Detailed recommendations of the City Engineer
- City Attorney review and approval of title commitment and homeowner association documentation.
- Review with Charles Joos, Fire Chief and City Attorney Larry Harris the closing of the road in the revised plat.

Motion by McInnis seconded by Evenski to approve Hans Hagen Homes 17th Addition, Preliminary Plat contingent upon the recommendations of City Planner Dean Johnson. Motion passed unanimously.
